

Designer Showcase Detail: Room Description

Sacred Space Landscape & Design transformed the open upper flagstone terrace into an intimate, comfortable seating and alfresco dining area. A bright and comfortable outdoor sofa is placed beneath a lush, free standing “Living Wall”. A “Living Wall” is a system where plants are inserted, then after rooting the wall system is installed vertically. The “Living Wall” panels lock together so that when watering from the top, the overflow water percolates down to the next row of plantings and so on. It is truly a thing of beauty. With all the texture and colour in the mass planting of 5 types of Sedum, the wall looks like a tapestry. Anyone sitting on the sofa beneath will be enveloped by green. A large Unilock bar, coffee table and pillars round out and define the space. The tumbled stone is the perfect contrast to the lush plant material placed throughout. A large Japanese Maple and established Serviceberry are two existing features that ground and compliment the area. See this area transformed from an exposed and unusable space, into a fantastic popular destination!
